Dr Kalam took a very keen interest in the work of 108 services in the North-East and many a times would say that, "saving a life is the greatest help one can do in this world", Dr. GVK Reddy added.

Mr K. Krishnam Raju- Director GVK EMRI, said that, "The GVK EMRI Board used to brief Dr Kalam at regular intervals on the progress made, and used to seek his constant guidance. He often used to enquire about the expansion of services to different parts of the country, and the progress made by leveraging technology in the 108 Emergency Response Center. Dr Kalam used to listen to EMTs and Pilots who work in ambulances, about their experiences in services which demanded going beyond the call of duty, and appreciated them whole heartedly," he added.
