



Chhatrapati Shivaji International Airport, Mumbai receives ISO 14064-1:2006 for its Carbon Emissions Accounting

For the second consecutive year, CSIA awarded the prestigious ISO certification

Mumbai, 14th March, 2013: GVK's Chhatrapati Shivaji International Airport (CSIA) managed by Mumbai International Airport Pvt. Ltd. (MIAL) has been awarded the prestigious ISO 14064-1:2006 certification for its Carbon Emissions Accounting by Bureau Veritas, a global leader in carbon certification worldwide, for the second year in a row. In 2012, CSIA had become the first ever airport in India and the second in Asia to be recognized for its consistent efforts in reducing its carbon footprint. With the certification this year, CSIA is now in the process of upgrading its ACI Airport Carbon Accreditation Rating from Mapping (Level 1) to Reduction (Level 2).

Carbon Management in Airport Operations has become a crucial benchmark across the globe due to the growing focus on this issue by the International Investor Community and Customer Demand. CSIA's total green house gas (GHG) emissions for the year 2012 has **reduced by 6193 tons CO₂e** as compared to 2011. This has been possible due to the various GHG Reduction and energy saving strategies as outlined in the Carbon Road Map of CSIA.

Commenting on CSIA receiving the ISO 14064-1:2006 certification, Mr. GV Sanjay Reddy, Managing Director, Mumbai International Airport Pvt. Ltd., said, "MIAL is committed to be at the forefront of the aviation industry's drive towards carbon-neutral growth with the aim of a sustainable future for the industry. We are proud to have received this certification, for the 2nd consecutive year. The certification is a reaffirmation of our long term commitment to help lower our environmental impact at CSIA."

As the most carbon conscious airport in India, CSIA has introduced a variety of measures to reduce carbon emissions from its operations. This is largely in line with MIAL's stated commitment to achieve environmental friendly and carbon neutral goals in the long-term. CSIA became the first airport in India, to initiate the mapping process voluntarily and submit emission levels to DGCA, in 2012. MIAL also released its first comprehensive corporate sustainability report, titled "The Sustainability Report 2012" that complies with rigorous international standards of the Global Reporting Initiative (GRI). With this, CSIA became the first airport in India to report on sustainability.
